Through intuitive web-based analytic dashboards, near-real time syndromic alerts, and email subscriptions of PDF reports, the NCBP/Biospatial platform enables state offices to better understand their public health data and take action when trends or anomalies are discovered. As part of this meeting, Biospatial will provide an update on the platform’s development and discuss the needs of state EMS offices concerning data analytics.</p>
