Call to Order / Self-Introductions

President Jim DeTienne (MT) called the meeting to order at 2:03 pm and Beth Armstrong called roll; a quorum was present.

Secretary's Report

Secretary Dennis Blair (AL) presented the June 12, 2014 Meeting Record.

ACTION: Katrina Altenhofen moved, seconded by Gary Brown to approve the Record

as presented. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Gary Brown reported that 12-months total revenue as of June 30, 2014 is \$1,625,156 and expenses are \$1,516,040. Net revenue is reported at \$109,115 and the current fund balance is \$954,560. The balance sheet includes \$52,570.19 in accounts receivable, investments of \$743,529.82 and cash of \$231,339.53.

Program Committee Report

Gary Brown reported that the program content has been finalized, the optional outing will occur Wednesday at the Rock-and-Roll Hall of Fame.

The 2015 Mid-Year Meeting will occur April 20-22 in San Antonio, TX.

Presidential Ponderings

• IAFC and the Field EMS Bill – IAFC has expressed concerns about the funding mechanism of the Field EMS Bill and with the proposed federal home. NAEMT has drafted a letter to be issued along with NAEMSP, NASEMSO, NEMSMA, NAEMSE and ACEP inviting IAFC officials to have an in-person discussion.

ACTION: President DeTienne will convey that NASEMSO will participate in the meeting with IAFC, but will not sign on to the invitation letter unless the antagonistic tone is changed. Alternatively, NASEMSO will communicate directly with IAFC.

- **Bridge-building within the EMS Community** President DeTienne asked for thoughts on how to increase collaboration within the community. It was suggested that a partnerships theme be considered for the NASEMSO 2015 Mid-Year Meeting.
- **AEMS Board** meets next week.

Executive Director's Report

- OSHA Emergency Response and Preparedness Stakeholder Meeting Kathy Robinson will represent NASEMSO at the July.
- NREMT Board Vacancy NASEMSO is asked to propose four candidates to replace the seat vacated by Brian Litza.
- **FEMA Meeting to Establish a National Mutual Aid System** Dia represented NASEMSO June 25-26 in DC. She made a presentation about the Recognition of EMS Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact (REPLICA).
- NHTSA Pending Cooperative Agreements Dia shared that NASEMSO has submitted proposed projects on EMS performance measures, to embed EMS fellows in regions 1 and 10, and on military-civilian transition issues.

• **Joint Reply Comment to FCC on Cellular 9-1-1 Indoor Location Accuracy** – Kevin McGinnis spoke about proposed comments including requiring location accuracy to 50 meters horizontally and 3 meters vertically.

ACTION: Paul Patrick moved, seconded by Paul Sharpe to support the input as described. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Government Information Committee Advocacy and Strategy
 Recommendations – recommendations include that the committee would be

chaired by the Past President and that committee membership would include partners. The strategy is "we achieve our mission by participation of all the states and territories while being a strong national voice for EMS." The Goal would be to "Serve as a permanent advocacy and governmental affairs information group for EMS."

ACTION:

Gary Brown moved, seconded by Chris Bell to accept the recommendations. Jim DeTienne will chair a work group to advance the effort. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

 Travel Assistance Awards – Gary Brown reported that they have received a record number of travel support requests, and are recommending that 19 of the 28 be funded.

ACTION: Joe Nelson moved, seconded by Brett Hart to approve the awards. The

motion passed by unanimous vote.

ACTION: Chris Bell withdrew the travel support request for the VT EMS data manager

and education & professional standards manager and moved, seconded by Paul Patrick to allocate an additional \$10,000 be spent if needed to support travel of additional state EMS personnel who have applied. The motion

passed by unanimous vote.

- East Lee Burns shared that the region had a spirited discussion regarding involvement of former EMS directors in the association. They concluded that an "ex officio" membership status be conferred only to "the best of the best."
- West Kyle Thornton asked colleagues to provide feedback on the recent influx of illegal immigrants.

They will forward recommended CoAEMSP nominees and also nominees to the Education Agenda Distance Education Group.
