A licensee shall collect &amp; provide pre-hospital care data to the board in a manner prescribed by the board. At a minimum, the data must include items identified by the board that are part of the National Uniform EMS Data Set. A licensee shall maintain pre-hospital care data for every response. --This policy is in accordance with the aforementioned statute that allows the Board to determine the manner in which the data will be provided. Enforcement done through correction orders &amp; fines in accordance with <a href="#">MN Statute</a>.</p>
