PROGRAM FOCUS AREAS

At a glance

Pediatric Education & Training

- Pediatric medication administration online tutorials created for use with the MI-MEDIC.
- Pediatric continuing education requirements increased for personnel re-licensure, effective 12/31/16.
- Direct On-Scene Education (DOSE) was added to all initial EMS education programs in the state which focuses on educating First Responders on identifying and correcting infant unsafe sleep environments during 911 calls.

Pediatric Data & Quality Improvement

- Since April of 2016, Michigan has been involved in the Pediatric Facility Recognition Quality Improvement Collaborative, in efforts to create a hospital recognition program for pediatrics for Emergency Departments.
- Implementation of the MI-MEDIC, Michigan Medication Emergency Dosing Intervention Card for the prevention of pediatric medication dosing errors for all ALS in MI.

Pediatric Safe Transport

- The EMS for Children program, with assistance of Trauma System funding, was able to purchase an Ambulance Child Restraint™ (ACR4) for every ambulance in the state of Michigan. The safe transportation of children is of utmost importance, and Michigan remains to be proactive on the issue.

Injury Prevention

- Michigan has adopted the Direct On-Scene Education (DOSE) program which educates First Responders on the importance of recognizing and correcting infant unsafe sleep environments. 515 portable cribs were purchased to support this effort, in which First Responders are able to donate to families that have unsafe sleep environments for their infants.
