



PEC Council Regional Organization

Job Description

Regional Leads:

- Are a members of the PEC Council Steering Committee
- Play a key role in attracting, engaging, retaining and mobilizing the region. They exemplify and promote strategies, mission, and actions to convey deep collaboration, education, inspiration, and transformation across state lines.
- Should increase awareness of the Council’s mission within their Region.
- Serve as liaisons to the full NASEMSO Region
- Should ensure PECC goals and objectives are included in NASEMSO Region discussions
- Foster the growth of new projects and ideas within their Region, which should relate to the goals and objectives of the Council
- Should maintain regular, ongoing communications with Council members within their region

General

- Each region elects a Representative and an Alternate (if the Region chooses)
- Elections will be held during Annual Meetings of odd years
 - Regions holding elections will vary depending on vacancies and terms
 - Depending on Regional representation at the in-person meetings, Regions can decide whether the vote will occur at the meeting (with proxy as needed) or online
- The Regional Representative and Alternate serve two year terms and are eligible for re-election
- In the event that the Regional Representative leaves their position, the Alternate Regional Representative fills the remaining term
- If both positions become vacant, the Steering Committee will nominate two Council members from the Region with the vacancies and hold an online vote to determine the result
 - The runner-up will take the Alternate position and both will serve until the next regularly scheduled election where both positions are up for election/re-election

Responsibilities of the Regional Representative

- Attend PECC Steering Committee meetings, when scheduled
- Attend NASEMSO Regional meetings
 - Report to the Region on important PECC happenings (as appropriate)
 - Report back to the Steering Committee on relevant Regional information.
- Schedule and run PECC Regional Meetings (need/frequency determined by regional members)
- Report to PECC relevant happenings from the Region (both full NASEMSO Regional meetings and PECC Regional meetings)
- Orient new members in the Region
 - NASEMSO Staff will send a welcome email to new members, and Regional Representatives will be included. Regional Representatives should also personally welcome new members in their Region, and offer support and guidance in their new role with NASEMSO

Responsibility of the Regional Alternate

- Fulfill the role of Regional Representative when absent or if position is vacated prior to end of term
